OVERVIEW:

The Japanese-Language Proficiency Test (JLPT) is an internationally accredited language examination that is offered in five different levels, designed to measure a person's Japanese-language skills.

ELEGIBILITY:

Anyone may register for the JLPT*; however, in principle, applicants should be non-native speakers of Japanese. *The American Association of Teachers of Japanese reserves the right to refuse JLPT registration to anyone for any reason.

TEST DATE: Sunday, December 7, 2014

TEST SITES: The JLPT will be held in 15 cities across the United States.

TEST RESULTS:
