June 23-28, 2008 CIBER Summer Institute for Teaching a Second Language for Business Communication, PennLauder CIBER, University of Pennsylvania, Philadelphia, PA

The Summer Institute for Teaching a Second Language for Business Communication is designed primarily for secondary and post-secondary language educators. This program includes an overview of basic business, combined with discussion of current issues in language-teaching methodology and curriculum design.

Participants work on group projects in which they design curriculum modules that apply the concepts addressed during the program. After the institute, participants receive a compilation of all the projects to enable them to adapt and use the modules in their own classroom situations.

Internet interactive technology now affords learner control and enables communicative learning that has become the web replacement for static online language learning content. Today's students are tuned-in and turned-on by digital media and a host of mobile devices, permitting them to communicate with others and share their experiences online. This summer institute is designed for language teachers who want to develop interactive digital content and make it accessible to their learners online. Demos and hands-on development will include:

- Producing audio/video resources for the internet
- Archiving and accessing resources on the Internet
- Converting media for the Internet & mobile devices
- Creating language Blogs, Mashups and Podcasts
- Integrating content with Web interactivity
- Creating virtual relationships

The CIBER Business Language Research & Teaching (BLRT) Consortium provides incentives for language faculty to teach and do research in a business context.

The members of the BLRT Consortium have pledged a portion of their Title VI CIBER grant funding to establish the BLRT Research Awards, in order to encourage faculty and graduate students in foreign language departments to add a business-language dimension to their research and teaching. The program is organized by the University of Kansas Center for International Business Education and Research (KU CIBER)

2008 BLRT Research Grant Awards

The Consortium invites applications from faculty, graduate students, and language professionals for this year's BLRT Research Grants.

Grants to researchers in three categories:

\$5,000 Grant to tenured faculty or tenure track

\$2,500 Grant to a Ph.D. candidate

\$2,500 Grant for research on business language pedagogy

All applicants should submit a research proposal with:

- project description
- timeline
- budget
- Curriculum Vita

Graduate students may provide an abstract of their proposal, but must also provide a letter from department Chair or Language Coordinator indicating support for the research described.

\$2,500 grant recipients will receive free registration at next year's CIBER Business Language Conference.

\$5,000 grant recipients will be invited to attend and present the results of the research.

BLRT Research Grant applications should be submitted to KU CIBER Associate Rebecca Murphy, ciber@ku.edu, Materials should be submitted by email, in Word, PDF, Excel, or similar readily accessible file type.
