## BRIDGING SCHOLARSHIPS, FALL 2012

The US-Japan Bridging Foundation has since 1999 provided scholarships through the American Association of Teachers of Japanese (AATJ) to assist students to study in Japan.

**The Bridging Project is accepting applications from American students participating in semester-or year-long study-abroad programs in Japan that begin between August and October 2012. The deadline for receipt of applications is April 6, 2012.**

Funding from private foundations and major U.S. corporations has made it possible for the Foundation to award at least 50 scholarships to assist students with the travel and living expenses they will incur while studying abroad in Japan. Contributors to the scholarship fund include Amway International, Steven and Sally Butters, Bloomberg LP, Chartis Insurance, Citigroup Japan, Deloitte Touche Tohmatsu, Estee Lauder, Exxon Mobil Y.K., the Freeman Foundation, Ichigo Asset Management, the JCC Fund, JP Morgan, Lockheed Martin, Kathy Matsui, Merrill Lynch, Mitsubishi International Corporation, Morgan Stanley Japan, Nomura Holding America, Oak Lawn Marketing, ORIX USA, Thierry Porte, Temple University–Japan Campus, the Terasaki Foundation, Toyota Motor Corporation, and TransPacific Hawaii College.

Undergraduate students majoring in any field of study are eligible to apply for these scholarships. Japanese language study is not a prerequisite.

Applicants must be U.S. citizens and be enrolled as undergraduates in a college or university in the U.S. Their terms of study in Japan should be at least three months in duration.

Recipients of Bridging Scholarships will receive a stipend of \$2,500 (for students on single-semester programs) or \$4,000 (for students on academic-year programs). The deadline for applications is **April 6, 2012**, for students who will be studying in Japan during the Fall 2012 semester or the 2012-13 academic year. **This is not a postmark deadline. All materials must be received by the end of business on Friday, April 6.**

The Bridging Scholarship application form is available on paper or as a Word form document that can be filled out online, printed, and mailed with other application materials. Go to <http://www.aatj.org/studyabroad/scholarships.html> for the form. Please submit three copies of all materials except transcripts and letters of recommendation. Faxed or emailed applications will not be accepted. The results of the selection will be announced in May. Selection is made by a committee and is based on academic potential and financial need.

Each scholarship recipient will be expected to send a brief report about his or her study in Japan to the ATJ office within 60 days of returning from abroad. These reports will be valuable for students, teachers, and advisors who are selecting study-abroad programs in Japan.

## INSTRUCTIONS FOR APPLICANTS

Please submit the following to the ATJ office by **April 6, 2012** for study beginning Fall 2012. Please note: Applications must be received (not postmarked) by the end of business on **April 6** in order to be considered.

1. A completed application form (three copies). The application form can be found at [www.aatj.org/studyabroad/scholarships.html](http://www.aatj.org/studyabroad/scholarships.html), filled out online, and downloaded and printed.
2. A short essay (up to 500 words) explaining your interest in study abroad in Japan (three copies).
3. An official transcript from your college or university.
4. A letter of recommendation from someone who knows you and is knowledgeable about your abilities and potential, preferably a professor or instructor in your major course of study. This may either be submitted together with the application or sent separately by the recommender; please note that it must be received by **April 6** in order for your application to be considered. *Faxed or emailed letters will NOT be accepted.*

Students planning to study in Japan in Spring 2013 should apply by **October 7, 2012**.
