



International (Yokota HS)



Qualification & Process

Academic criteria for student induction in JNHS are as follows:

- completed the first term of his/her second-year Japanese language course in middle/junior high or a senior high school;
- maintained a 3.5 GPA in Japanese courses and an overall 3.0 GPA.
- *The sponsoring teacher is responsible to check the qualification. AATJ does not get involved.

Qualification for School

- Schools offering both middle/junior high and senior high school level Japanese language classes may establish both JNHS Junior and JNHS Senior chapters within one school.
- Each JNHS chapter must operate independently.
- All accredited public and non-public middle/junior high and senior high schools are eligible to establish a chapter.

*The teachers must be members for the current year of AATJ.



Application Process

Sponsoring teachers then submit an application form together with

- a list of students and
- 2. the applicable fee (a \$25 chapter fee per academic year; \$8 per nominated student; and \$8 each for red & white cords).
 Shipping and handling charges are included in the fee.

*Recommended to apply <u>at least one month before</u> they plan to honor students

College chapter 大学

Qualification & Process



- Took 5 semester courses (or 7 courses in quarter system)
- GPA: 3.5 in Japanese language courses; GPA: 3.0 overall
- Up to 2 transfer courses (or 3 quarter courses) can be counted towards GPA



- 2-Year College: Completion of 3 semesters (or 5 quarter courses)
- Nominate in the graduating semester to be inducted

:) Teachers identify students who are in good standing and close to graduation. Have those students submit internal application to the Chapter sponsor for review the above criteria.

Application Process

- Sponsor (nominating teacher) must be a current member of AATJ
- Twice a year nomination: Fall and Spring
- Chapter fee: \$25 per year
- Student application fee: \$20 per student
- Takes about 4 weeks to receive the certificate and cord





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Mini Grant for 5 schools, \$300 each

Application detail:

- a. Submit itemized list and estimated amount (example: charter bus, etc.)
- b. Eligibility
 - i. Current AATJ Member
 - ii. Activity must involve JNHS as a part of advocacy, seeding money
 - iii. Require to write a report about activity
- c. Examples of use of the grant for chapter activities
 - i. Induction ceremony and reception
 - ii. Speaker honorarium/gift
 - iii. Onigiri action
 - iv. Japan Cultural Festival/activities support
 - v. JNHS T-shirts
 - vi. Expense for exchange projects such as pen pal postage
- d. This grant should not be used for...
 - i. JNHS Chapter fee
 - ii. JNHS Student application fee
 - iii. Delivery/mailing fee
 - iv. Gift card, etc.



Mini Grant for 5 schools, \$300 each

- **Application period:** 3/1-4/30/ 2025
- Mini Grant usage period: 8/1/2025 7/31/2026
- Sample activity: Induction ceremony and reception, speaker honorarium, onigiri action, JNHS T-shirts, etc.
- Mini Grant will not be used for...
 - -student application fee/postage


